CRIME.

Crime figures for the period 18th December 09 to 15th January 10 are up from 44 crimes reported last year to 60 this year.

The main offences were: -

Assault - 18

Theft - 8

Burglary - 7

Criminal damage - 7

Shoplifting - 4

Drugs – 3 (Drugs warrant carried in Granby Street - cannabis seized)

Anti-social behaviour incidents recorded in the same period in 2008 were 39 compared with 61 for this year.

A Street audit has been completed in Granby Street following the problems there early in December.

Residents were asked the question 'How safe do you feel?' 58% said they felt safe.

Plans are in hand to try and utilise an unoccupied flat for a multi-agency type surgery there.
