CRIME.

Crime figures for the period 6th November to 13th November are down from 20 crimes reported last year to 10 this year. These include: -

One theft from motor vehicle a white transit van parked in Granby Street overnight 6/7th November, window smashed to gain entry and large number of CD's stolen.

A drugs warrant was executed in Cannon Street, one person arrested and a quantity of heroin seized.
