CRIME.

Crime figures for the period 16th October to 23rd October are up from 11 crimes reported last year to 14 this year. These include: -

Attempt theft from motor vehicle overnight 19/20th, window in white van parked in Raglan Road smashed, nothing stolen.

Stolen pedal cycle from Clowance Street on 16th approx. 8.00pm, described as black and red Trek, mans mountain bike.

Hilti cordless screwdriver stolen from St. Aubyn church between 8.00am and 4.00pm on 21st.

Drugs- one seizure, small amount of cocaine.

Anti-social behaviour incidents recorded in the same period in 2008 were 7 compared with 16 for this year.
