DEVONPORT

CRIME.

Crime figures for the period 4th September to 11th September are down on last years, from 14 crimes reported last year to 10 this year.

These included one assault and one stolen vehicle, details as follows: -

An assault occurred at about 1235pm on Tuesday 8th September in Park Avenue near Devonport Park when a male assaulted a female. He is described as white, aged around 25 to 26 years old, 5ft 9in to 5ft 10in tall, skinny build wearing a blue short sleeved button up shirt, blue jeans, with brown fairly short hair appeared gelled or greasy, clean shaven with local accent and bulging brown eyes.

A Nissan Primera Estate car, red in colour, registration number T478KFL, was stolen from Devonport Hill overnight on the 7/8th September and so far not recovered.

Anti-social behaviour incidents recorded in the same period in 2008 were 7 compared with 11 for this year.
