CRIME.

Crime figures for the period 4th December to 11th December are up from 12 crimes reported last year to 16 this year.

These include: -

Three assaults, four criminal damages, four thefts, one burglary and four others.

The burglary occurred at a flat in Marlborough Street during the evening of Sunday 6th December. A Playstation and games were stolen.

Criminal damage caused to a blue Hyundai parked in Lofoten Close between 4th and 7th December.

Criminal damage caused to a moped in St Aubyn Road at about 11.00pm on Thurs 10th December.

Criminal damage caused to a communal door in James Street overnight on 9/10th December.

Anyone with any information on the above can contact the team or anonymously to Crimestoppers on 0800 555111.

Anti-social behaviour incidents recorded in the same period in 2008 were 9 compared with 16 for this year.

There were two drugs related deaths in Granby Street in the last week; the New Deals team is working with other agencies to address problems in the area.
