CRIME.

Crime figures for the period 13th November to 20th November are down from 17 crimes reported last year to 14 this year.

These include: -

One theft from motor vehicle; mobile phone stolen from a Mitsubishi estate parked in Chapel Street on Tues. 17th bet. 12:15 and 2:00pm.

Another theft from motor vehicle; MP3 player stolen from a transit van parked in the Mecca Bingo car park on Weds 18th bet. 10:30 am and 1:00pm.

Theft from the Lord Beresford PH between midnight and 5:00am on Sat.14th November, handbag and cash stolen.

Anti-social behaviour incidents recorded in the same period in 2008 were 7 compared with 10 for this year.
