### **DEVONPORT**

#### CRIME.

Crime figures for the period 30<sup>th</sup> October to 6<sup>th</sup> November are down from 22 crimes reported last year to 19 this year.

These include: -

Arson- firework thrown into the Co-op at Duke Street, at about 7.00pm on Fri.  $30^{\rm th}$  October. Group of youths suspected as being responsible.

Burglary- Silver boys' mountain bike stolen from a communal stairway in Raglan Road overnight 31<sup>st</sup> October.

Two firework related offences, one arrest, enquiries ongoing re second offence.

One arrest for making hoax 999 calls.

**Drugs - 2 stopchecks resulting in seizures of small amounts of cannabis.**

Anti-social behaviour incidents recorded in the same period in 2008 were 21 compared with 39 for this year.
