### DEVONPORT

Crime figures for the period 9<sup>th</sup> October to 16<sup>th</sup> October are up from 8 crimes reported last year to 21 this year.

These include: -

An arson in Cornwall Street just after midnight on 13<sup>th</sup>, white van set on fire.

Criminal damage at Parkside School – Windows broken between 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. This is an ongoing problem since the premises were unoccupied, if you see any suspicious activity, please ring in.

Theft of pedal cycle from Devonport House overnight 13/14<sup>th</sup> described as a blue Apollo mountain bike.

Two drugs seizures of cannabis and heroin.
