## DEVONPORT

### CRIME.

Crime figures for the period 23<sup>rd</sup> October to 30<sup>th</sup> October are down from 16 crimes reported last year to 14 this year.

These include: -

Two arsons at the back of Marlborough Street, late on Fri. 23<sup>rd</sup>, two wheeley bins set on fire.

Burglary to flat in Marlborough Street, daytime on Mon. 26<sup>th</sup>, ring, watch, Playstation and games stolen.

Theft of motor vehicle, a Blue Ranger Rover reg. number X 931 BTT, from Cumberland Street between 24<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>.

Anti-social behaviour incidents recorded in the same period in 2008 were 13 compared with 23 for this year.
